**Grading scale**: Belgian grades are distributed on a scale from 0-20 with 10 being the passing grade (the Namur grading system includes a 'low pass' grade. The final decision whether a student fails or passes, is taken on the basis of his/her overall score. Thus, it is possible for a student who has obtained 8 or 9 out of 20 for one individual module to pass overall.). In terms of ECTS grades: 20-18 at UNamur correspond to an A, 17-16=B, 15-14=C, 13-12=D, 11-10=E, 8-9= FX <7=F. UNamur will provide you with a transcript of record containing the Belgian grades, and the ECTS equivalents. The actual conversion is then being done at your home university.

**Language Proficiency Requirements:** None for English, French B1 if learning agreements contains classes taught in French (the course offerings in English are limited). A certificate proving your level of French is required.
